

Fusion I-Tip Placement Guide

Individual bond placement for the most natural result.

- 1 Section the Hair**
Create thin horizontal section at nape, 1 inch above hairline. Working strand by strand. Clip rest up with sectioning clips.
- 2 Thread the Loop Tool**
Insert hook end of loop tool through a micro-ring bead. Pull small section of natural hair (10-15 strands) through bead.
- 3 Insert the I-Tip**
Slide I-tip strand into bead alongside natural hair. Position bead ~1cm from scalp - close for coverage, far enough to avoid root pressure.
- 4 Crimp the Bead**
Flat-jaw pliers clamp bead from outside to flatten. Crimp firmly but don't damage hair. Flat beads sit closer to scalp than round.
- 5 Continue Row by Row**
Space bonds ~1cm apart. Next section: offset bonds in brick-layer pattern. Avoid perimeter zone (1 inch from any hairline).

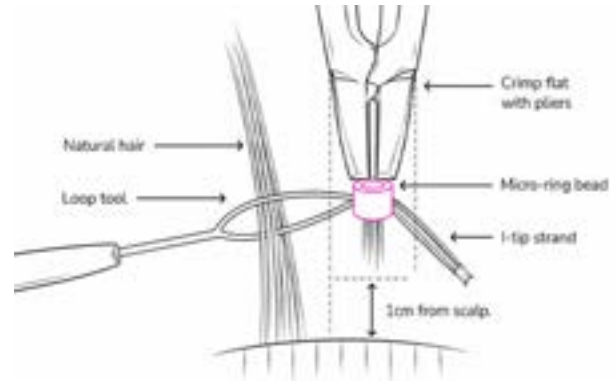


For Textured & Natural Hair (3B-4C)

- Use cold fusion (bead method) instead of heat bonds to protect natural curl
- Thread natural hair through bead before inserting I-tip
- Crimp flat to minimize visibility and maximize comfort
- Check every bond by gently tugging - if it slides, re-crimp

Aftercare, Maintenance & Troubleshooting

Care & Styling

Washing: Wash downward. Never scrub or bunch at bonds. Sulfate-free. Condition mid-lengths to ends.

Brushing: Loop brush. Hold bonds while brushing. Start from ends. Brush 2-3x daily.

Sleeping: Loose braid or low ponytail. Silk pillowcase to reduce friction

Heat Styling: Heat protectant always. Keep tools away from beads. Below 350°F.

Move-Ups: Every 8-12 weeks. Uncrimp, slide up, re-crimp at correct distance.

Troubleshooting

Issue	Solution
Bond slipping	Bead not flat enough. Re-crimp or replace bead.
Bead visible	Match bead color to hair. Dark for dark, blonde for light.
Pulling at scalp	Too close to scalp. Reposition 1cm from root.
Matting at bonds	Brush 2-3x daily, holding the bonds.
Thinning at bond sites	Too many bonds or tension. Reduce density.
